Adams, India

India Adams (5 March 1927 – 25 April 2020) was an American singer, known as the ghost singer who dubbed the singing voices of Cyd Charisse and Joan Crawford in the mid-1950s.

Adams, Mac

Mac Adams (born 1943) is a Welsh artist living and working in New York State.

Akerman, Chantal

Chantal Akerman (6 June 1950 – 5 October 2015) was a Belgian film director, screenwriter, artist, and film professor at the City College of New York.

Albertine, Viv

Viviane ‘Viv’ Albertine (born 1954) is an Australian-born British musician, singer, songwriter and writer, and the guitarist for the punk band *The Slits* (1977 – 1982), living and working in London.

Albini, Steve

Steven Albini (born 1961) is an American musician, record producer, audio engineer, and music journalist, former musician of the bands *Big Black*, *Rapeman*, and *Flour*, and co founder of *Shellac*, living and working in Chicago.

Anger, Kenneth

Kenneth Anger (born Kenneth Wilbur Anglemeyer, 1927) is an American underground experimental filmmaker, actor and author living and working in Los Angeles.

Apollinaire, Guillaume

Guillaume Apollinaire (26 August 1880 – 9 November 1918) was a French poet, playwright, writer, novelist, and art critic of Polish-Belarusian descent.

Aragon, Louis

Louis Aragon (3 October 1897 – 24 December 1982) was a French poet, novelist and editor.

Archigram

Archigram was an avant-garde architectural group formed in the 1960s. Based at the Architectural Association in London, the main members of the group were Peter Cook (born 1936), Warren Chalk (1927–1988), Ron Herron (1930–1994), Dennis Crompton (born 1935), Michael Webb (born 1937) and David Greene (born 1937).

Arman

Arman (17 November 1928 – 22 October 2005) was a French-born American artist and member of the Nouveau réalisme.

Armleder, John

John Armleder (born 1948) is a Swiss performance artist, painter, sculptor, critic, and curator living and working in Geneva.

Art & Language

Art & Language is a pioneering British conceptual art group founded in 1968 by Terry Atkinson (born 1939), David Bainbridge (1941–2013), Michael Baldwin (born 1945) and Harold Hurrell (born 1940). It now consists of Michael Baldwin (born 1945) and Mel Ramsden (born 1944).

Artist Placement Group

The Artist Placement Group was conceived by Barbara Steveni in London in 1965, and established in 1966 as an artist-run organisation seeking to refocus art outside the gallery, predominantly through attaching an artist in a business or governmental context for a period of time.

Ascott, Roy

Roy Ascott (born in 1934) is a British artist and educator, and a practitioner of interactive computer art, electronic art, cybernetic art and telematic art, living and working in Glastonbury.

Asher, Michael

Michael Asher (15 July 1943 – 15 October 2012) was an American conceptual artist.

Atkinson, Terry

Terry Atkinson (born 1939) is a British artist.

Awan, Nishat

Nishat Awan is a Senior Lecturer in the Department of Visual Cultures at Goldsmiths, University of London.

Backström, Fia

Fia Backström (born 1970) is a Swedish artist, writer and educator living and working in New York City.

Baldwin, Michael

Michael Baldwin (born 1945) is a British conceptual artist, author and founding member of Art & Language, living in Middleton Cheney, near Banbury, England.

Ban, Shigeru

坂 茂 – Shigeru Ban (born 1957) is a Japanese architect and the 37th recipient of the Pritzker Architecture Prize living and working in Tokyo.

Barry, Robert

Robert Barry (born 1936) is an American artist living and working in New Jersey.

Bel, Jérôme

Jérôme Bel (born 1964) is a French dancer and choreographer living and working in Paris.

Bengolea, Cecilia

Cecilia Bengolea (born 1979) is an Argentinian dancer and choreographer, co founder with François Chaignaud of the dance company *Vlovajob Pru*, living and working in Paris.

Beuys, Joseph

Joseph Beuys (12 May 1921 – 23 January 1986) was a German Fluxus, happening, and performance artist as well as a painter, sculptor, medallist, installation artist, graphic artist, art theorist, and pedagogue.

Bök, Christian

Christian Bök (born 1966) is an experimental Canadian poet and Professor in Creative Writing at the University of Melbourne, Australia.

Bokaer, Jonah

Jonah Bokaer (born 1981) is an American choreographer and media artist living and working in New York City.

Bomberg, David

David Bomberg (5 December 1890 – 19 August 1957) was a British painter, educator, associated with the Vorticist movement.

Bovier, François

François Bovier (born 1972) is a Swiss lecturer and researcher at the History of Cinema Section at the University of Lausanne (UNIL) and research fellow at the Cantonal Art School of Lausanne (ECAL), co-founder of the journal *Décadrages* and co-director of the PlanSécant collection (MetisPresses), living and working in Geneva.

Bow Wow Wow

Bow Wow Wow are a British new wave band created by manager Malcolm McLaren in 1980, and consisted of Barbarossa (also known as Dave Barbe, born 1961), guitarist Matthew Ashman (3 November 1960 – 21 November 1995), bassist Leigh Gorman (born 1961) and Annabella Lwin (born 1966).

Boyle, Mark

Mark Boyle (11 May 1934 – 4 May 2005) was a Scottish artist, working as the 'Boyle Family' together with his partner Joan Hills (born 1931,) and their two children too (Sebastian, born 1962 and Georgia, born 1963).

Brecht, George

George Brecht (27 August 1926 – 5 December 2008) was an American conceptual artist and avant-garde composer, a key member of, and influence on, Fluxus, as well as a professional chemist.

André Breton

André Breton (18 February 1896 – 28 September 1966) was a French writer and poet, and co-founder and principal theorist of the Surrealism movement.

Breyer P-Orridge, Genesis

Genesis Breyer P-Orridge (22 February 1950 – 14 March 2020) was a British singer-songwriter, musician, artist, poet, performance artist, founder of *COUM Transmissions*, co founder of *Throbbing Gristle*, *Thee Temple ov Psychick Youth*, and *Psychic TV*.

Brisley, Stuart

Stuart Brisley (born in 1933) is a British artist, living and working in London.

Brouwn, Stanley

Stanley Brouwn (25 June 1935 – 18 May 2017) was a Suriname-born Dutch conceptual artist.

Brüggemann, Stefan

Stefan Brüggemann (born 1975) is a Mexican artist living and working between Mexico City and London.

Buren, Daniel

Daniel Buren (born 1938) is a French conceptual artist, cofounder of BMPT, living and working in Paris.

Burgin, Victor

Victor Burgin (born in 1941) is a British artist, educator and a writer, living and working in London.

Cage, John

John Cage (5 September 1912 – 12 August 1992) was an American composer, music theorist, artist, and philosopher.

Carnevale, Graciela

Graciela Carnevale (born 1942) is an Argentinian artist, co founder of the Grupo de Arte de Vanguardia de Rosario, and co organiser of the Ciclo de Arte Experimental exhibition (1968), living and working in Rosario, Argentina.

Cave, Nick

Nick Cave (born 1957) is an Australian singer, songwriter, author, screenwriter, composer and occasional actor, best known for fronting the rock band *Nick Cave and the Bad Seeds*, living and working in Brighton.

César

César (born Cesare Baldaccini, 1 January 1921 – 6 December 1998) was a French artist and member of the Nouveau réalisme.

Chaimowicz, Marc Camille

Marc Camille Chaimowicz (born in 1947) is a French born London-based contemporary artist, living and working in London.

Charmatz, Boris

Boris Charmatz (Born 1973), is a French dancer, choreographer, director of Terrain, and former director of *Musée de la danse / Centre chorégraphique national de Rennes et de Bretagne* (2009 – 2018).

Cladders, Johannes

Johannes Cladders (14 September 1924 – 6 February 2009) was a German curator, art journalist, visual artist and museum director in Mönchengladbach.

Galerie Iris Clert

The Iris Clert Gallery (Galerie Iris Clert, active from 1955 to 1976) was an art gallery named after its Greek owner and curator, Iris Clert (28 April 1918 – 15 August 1986).

Conrad, Tony

Tony Conrad (7 March 1940 – 9 April 2016) was an American avant-garde video artist, experimental filmmaker, musician, composer, sound artist, teacher, and writer.

Cosey Fanni Tutti

Cosey Fanni Tutti (born Christine Carol Newby, 1951) is a British performance artist, musician, and writer, cofounder of *Throbbing Gristle* and *Chris & Cosey*, living and working in Norfolk.

Davies, Ivor

Ivor Davies MBE (born 1935) is a Welsh artist living and working in Penarth.

de Vries, Herman

Herman de Vries (born 1931) is a Dutch artist.

Decrauzat, Philippe

Philippe Decrauzat (born 1974) is a Swiss painter and filmmaker living and working in Paris.

Downsbrough, Peter

Peter Downsbrough (born 1940) is American artist living and working in Brussels.

Duchamp, Marcel

Marcel Duchamp (28 July 1887 – 2 October 1968) was a French-American painter, sculptor, chess player, and writer.

Egli, Philippe

Philipp Egli (born 1966) is a Swiss choreographer, artistic director, director and teacher at *TANZraum in Affoltern am Albis*, instructor at *Tanzwerk 101* and the Heilpädagogische Hochschule in Zurich, and is the former director of the Theater St. Gallen and the theater's dance school (2000-2009).

Engels, Friedrich

Friedrich Engels (28 November 1820 – 5 August 1895) was a German philosopher, historian, social scientist, and sociologist.

Etchells, Tim

Tim Etchells (born 1962) is a British dramaturge, artist and writer, and the artistic director, and cofounder, of the collective *Forced Entertainment*, living and working in London and Sheffield.

Fisher, Morgan

Morgan Fisher (born 1942) is an American experimental filmmaker and artist living and working in Los Angeles.

Flanagan, Barry

Barry Flanagan (11 January 1941 – 31 August 2009) was a Welsh sculptor.

Flynt, Henry

Henry Flynt (born 1940) is an American philosopher, avant-garde musician, artist and activist living and working in New York.

Fuller, R. Buckminster

Richard Buckminster Fuller (12 July 1895 – 1 July 1983) was an American architect, systems theorist, author, designer, inventor, and futurist.

Godard, Jean-Luc

Jean-Luc Godard (born 1930) is a French-Swiss film director, screenwriter and film critic, a pioneer of the 1960s French New Wave film movement, living and working in Rolle, Switzerland.

Goldsmith, Kenneth

Kenneth Goldsmith (born 1961) is an American poet and critic, founder of Ubuweb, living and working in New York City.

Grandrieux, Philippe

Philippe Grandrieux (born 1954) is a French film director and screenwriter, living and working in Paris.

Lucy Lippard (born 1937) is an American writer, art critic, activist and curator living and working in Galisteo, New Mexico.

Long, Richard

Richard Long (born in 1945) is an English sculptor, pioneer of Land Art, living and working in Bristol.

Lovay, Balthazar

Balthazar Lovay (born 1978) is a Swiss independent curator, was the artistic director of Fri Art, Kunsthalle Fribourg (2013 – 2019) and co-founded and directed Hard Hat in Geneva (2006 to 2013,) living and working in Geneva.

Love, Tim

Tim Love is the founding principal of Utile, an architecture and urban planning firm in Downtown Boston.

Lunch, Lydia

Lydia Lunch (born 1959) is an American singer, poet, writer, actress and self-empowerment speaker, living and working in Brooklyn.

Liotard, Jean-François

Jean-François Lyotard (10 August 1924 – 21 April 1998) was a French philosopher, sociologist, and literary theorist.

Mac Low, Jackson

Jackson Mac Low (12 September 1922 – 8 December 2004) was an American poet, performance artist, composer and playwright.

Manzoni, Piero

Piero Manzoni (13 July 1933 – 6 February 1963) was an Italian artist.

Marcuse, Herbert

Herbert Marcuse (19 July 1898 – 29 July 1979) was a German-American philosopher, sociologist, and political theorist, associated with the Frankfurt School of Critical Theory.

Marquez, Anne

Anne Marquez is the French author of *Godard, le dos au musée – Histoire d'une exposition*, Les Presses du Reel, 2014.

McLaren, Malcolm

Malcolm McLaren (22 January 1946 – 8 April 2010) was a British impresario, visual artist, performer, musician, clothes designer and boutique owner, and promoter and manager of bands the *New York Dolls* and *The Sex Pistols*.

Maréchal, Sylvain

Sylvain Maréchal (15 August 1750 – 18 January 1803) was a French essayist, poet, philosopher and political theorist.

Marx, Karl

Karl Marx (5 May 1818 – 14 March 1883) was a German philosopher, economist, historian, sociologist, and political theorist.

McLean, Bruce

Bruce McLean (born in 1944) is a Scottish sculptor, performance artist and painter, living and working in London.

Medalla, David

David Medalla (23 March 1942 – 28 December 2020) was a Filipino international artist whose work ranged from sculpture and kinetic art to painting, installation and performance art. He lived and worked in Bracknell, Manila and Berlin.

Mesch, Claudia

Claudia Mesch is an American professor of art history at Arizona State University.

Metzger, Gustav

Gustav Metzger (10 April 1926 – 1 March 2017) was a German born apatrid artist and political activist that lived since 1939 in the UK.

Philippe-Alain Michaud (born 1961) is a French art historian, theoretician, and curator in charge of films at the National Museum of Modern Art Georges Pompidou in Paris, living and working in Paris.

Joseph Hillis Miller Jr. (born 1928) is an American literary critic.

Moeglin-Delcroix, Anne

Anne Moeglin-Delcroix is a French Professor of philosophy of art, University of Paris 1 Panthéon-Sorbonne, and was responsible for the artists' books collection at the Bibliothèque nationale de France (1979 – 1994), living and working in Paris.

Monk, Meredith

Meredith Monk (born 1942) is an American composer, performer, director, vocalist, filmmaker, and choreographer living and working in New York City.

Morea, Ben

Ben Morea (born 1941) is an American artist and activist, co founder of the collectives Black Mask and Up Against The Wall Motherfuckers living and working in New York City.

Morris, Robert

Robert Morris (9 February 1931 – 28 November 2018) was an American sculptor, conceptual artist and writer.

Murdock, James

James Murdock is the author of “Drawing, Thinking, and Digitizing: Recession’s Modus Operandi,” *Architectural Record*, December 2009, 37-38.

Nein, Lilo

Lilo Nein (born 1980) is an Austrian visual artist, performer, and writer living and working in Vienna.

Niblock, Phill

Phill Niblock (born 1933) is an American composer, filmmaker, photographer and director of Experimental Intermedia living and working in New York City.

Nickas, Bob

Bob Nickas is a critic and curator, living and working in New York City.

NO!Art

NO!art was a radical avant-garde anti-art movement started in New York in 1959, initiated by Boris Lurie (18 July 1924 – 7 January 2008), Sam Goodman (1919 – 1967), and Stanley Fisher (1926 – 1980).

Nordman, Maria

Maria Nordman (born 1943) is an American artist living and working in Los Angeles.

Novalis

Novalis was the pseudonym and pen name of Georg Philipp Friedrich Freiherr von Hardenberg (2 May 1772 – 25 March 1801), a poet, author, mystic, and philosopher of Early German Romanticism.

Obrist, Hans Ulrich

Hans Ulrich Obrist (born 1968) is a Swiss art curator, critic, historian of art and artistic director at the Serpentine Galleries, living and working in London.

Ondák, Roman

Roman Ondak (born 1966) is a Slovak conceptual artist, living and working in Bratislava.

Ono, Yoko

Yoko Ono (born in 1933) is a Japanese multimedia artist, singer, songwriter and peace activist, living and working in New York City.

Paolozzi, Eduardo

Eduardo Paolozzi (7 March 1924 – 22 April 2005) was a Scottish sculptor, artist, and a Pop Art pioneer.

Paper Architects

Paper Architects is a Russian group that included Michael Belov, Alexander Brodsky and Ilya Utkin, Mikhail Flippov, Nadia Bronzova and Yuri Avvakumov amongst others, producing paper architecture.

Parent, Claude

Claude Parent (26 February 1923 – 27 February 2016) was a French architect, polemicist and theoretician.

Parreno, Philippe

Philippe Parreno (born 1964) is a French artist living and working in Paris.

Parsons Michael

Michael Edward Parsons (born 1938) is a British composer, and cofounder of the *Scratch Orchestra* together with Cornelius Cardew and Howard Skempton, living and working in London.

Parsons, Laurie

Laurie Parsons (born 1959) is a retired American artist active in the late 1980s and early 1990s, and now works as a social worker.

Pellegrin, Julie

Julie Pellegrin (born 1975) is a French curator and former director of the centre of contemporary art La ferme du Buisson, living and working in Paris.

Perret, Mai-Thu

Mai-Thu Perret (born 1976) is a Swiss artist of Franco-Vietnamese origin, living and working in Geneva.

Phillpot, Clive

Clive Phillpot (born 1938) is a British specialist on artists' books, essayist, art writer, curator, librarian, and former the Museum of Modern Art Library in New York, living and working in London.

Pop, Iggy

James Newell Osterberg Jr. (born 1947), better known as Iggy Pop, is an American singer, songwriter, musician, record producer, and actor living and working in Miami, and was the vocalist and lyricist of influential proto-punk band *the Stooges*, formed in 1967, living and working in Miami.

Portnoy, Michael

Michael Portnoy (born 1971) is an American multimedia artist, choreographer, musician, actor, curator, and Director of Behaviour living and working in New York City.

Poss, Robert

Robert Poss (born 1956) is an American guitarist and music producer, co-founder of *Band of Susans*, living and working in New York City.

Prini, Emilio

Emilio Prini (1943 – 1 September 2016) was an Italian artist, associated with the Arte Povera movement.

Ranaldo, Lee

Lee Ranaldo (born 1956) is an American musician, singer-songwriter, guitarist, writer, visual artist, record producer, and co-founder of Sonic Youth living and working in New York City.

Restany, Pierre

Pierre Restany (24 June 1930 – 29 May 2003) was a French art critic and cultural philosopher, founder of the Nouveau Réalisme.

Ribemont-Dessaignes, Georges

Georges Ribemont-Dessaignes (19 June 1884 – 9 July 1974) was a French writer, playwright and artist, associated with the Dada movement.

Rivera, Diego

Diego Rivera (8 December 1886 – 24 November 1957) was a Mexican painter.

Rosenthal, Norman

Sir Norman Rosenthal (born 1944) is a British independent curator and art historian, former Director of Exhibitions at the Institute of Contemporary Arts, London, and Exhibitions Secretary of the Royal Academy between 1977 and 2008 living and working in London.

Rossi, Aldo

Aldo Rossi (3 May 1931 – 4 September 1997) was an Italian architect and designer.

Russell, Bertrand

Bertrand Russell (18 May 1872 – 2 February 1970) was a British polymath, philosopher, logician, mathematician, historian, writer, social critic, political activist, and Nobel laureate.

Rutault, Claude

Claude Rutault (born 1941) is a French painter living and working in Vaucresson.

Sadier, Laetitia

Lætitia Sadier (born 1968) is a French musician, co-founder of avant-pop band *Stereolab*, living and working in London.

Schaffter Sahli

Schaffter Sahli is a Swiss Graphic Designer studio founded by Joanna Schaffter and Vincent Sahli.

Schames, Samson

Sex Pistols

Kristine Stiles (born 1947) is an historian of contemporary art and artists' writings, and the France Family Professor of Art, Art History and Visual Studies at Duke University, Durham, North Carolina.

Strong, Anna Louise

Anna Louise Strong (24 November 1885 – 29 March 1970) was an American journalist and activist.

Summers, Elaine

Elaine Summers (20 February 1925 – 27 December 2014) was an American choreographer, experimental filmmaker, and founder of Experimental Intermedia.

Superstudio

Townshend, Pete

Pete Townshend (born 1945) is an English guitarist, singer and composer. He is co-founder, leader, guitarist, secondary lead vocalist and principal songwriter of the Who.

Szeemann, Harald

Harald Szeemann (11 June 1933 – 18 February 2005) was a Swiss curator, Kunsthalle Bern director, and art historian.

The Chiffons

The Motherfuckers

Up Against the Wall Motherfucker, often shortened as The Motherfuckers or UAW/MF, was an anarchist group based in New York City. The Motherfuckers grew out of Black Mask, originally formed in 1966 by Ben Morea (born 1941) and Dan Georgakas (born 1938).

The New York Five

The New York Five was a group of architects based in New York City that included Peter Eisenman, Michael Graves, Charles Gwathmey, John Hejduk and Richard Meier.

The Shirelles

The Shirelles were an American girl group active from 1957 to 1982 that consisted of Shirley Owens (later Shirley Alston Reeves), Doris Coley (later Doris Kenner-Jackson), Addie "Micki" Harris (later Addie Harris McFadden), and Beverly Lee.

Tinguely, Jean

Jean Tinguely (22 May 1925 – 30 August 1991) was a Swiss artist and member of the Nouveau réalisme.

Tomii, Dr Reiko

Dr. Reiko Tomii is a Japanese independent art historian and curator, living and working in New York City.

Trotsky, Leon

Leon Trotsky (born Lev Davidovich Bronstein, 7 November 1879 – 21 August 1940) was a Soviet revolutionary, Marxist theorist and politician.

Apichatpong Weerasethakul (born 1970) is a Thai independent film director, screenwriter, and film producer living and working in Chiang Mai.

Weibel, Peter

Peter Weibel (born 1944) is an Austrian post-conceptual artist, curator, new media theoretician, Chairman and CEO of the ZKM | Center for Art and Media Karlsruhe (1999 –) and director of the Peter Weibel Research Institute for digital Cultures at the University of Applied Arts Vienna (2017 –) living and working in Karlsruhe.
